Youth Hardship Fund

The Youth Hardship Fund has been run in partnership with The Zone for its first 12 months now and has been hugely successful. Following a £10,000 input from us and careful management from the Zone we know we have made a huge impact on many young people's lives.

The statistics speak for themselves and we know that in 12 months we have helped 318 young people avoid times of personal and financial crisis – for the full report follow this <u>link</u>. 2013

Royal Naval and Royal Marines Charity

VCS Training Fund

The Plymouth VCS Training Fund is for small Plymouth based voluntary and community sector organisations that need funding for training.

The fund covers any type of training and is does not need to be accredited.

In its first round of two we aimed to help 20 community groups receive training to take their organisation forward. The applications came soaring in and we surpassed our target and funded 21 groups.

A second grant round will open in January 2014 where we aim to help another 20 groups with important training.
